Second Reading: Colossians 1: 15-20

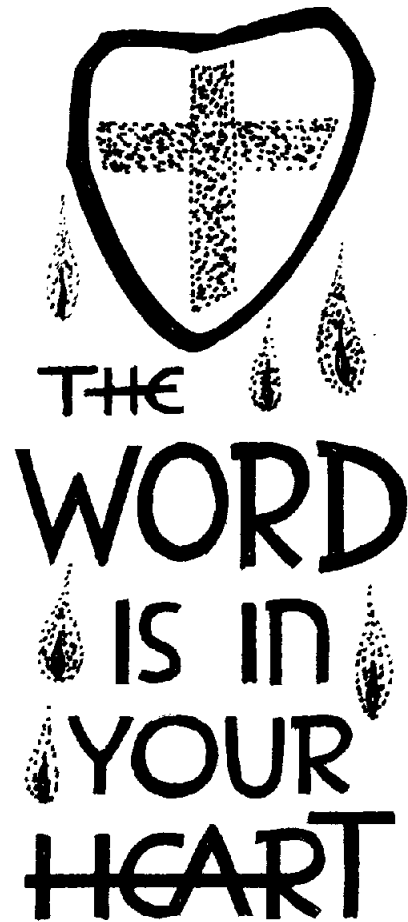
All things are created and reconciled through Christ.

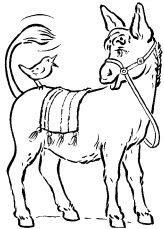
Who keeps ringing those bells'?
